

Joining Respond as a Trustee

What is Respond?

Respond is a charity that helps people with learning disabilities and autistic people who have experienced trauma.

Trauma means things like sexual or physical abuse, neglect and abuse in institutional settings, or being the victims of crime.

What is Respond looking for?

Respond would like to recruit people with learning disabilities and autistic people to its Board.

The Board is the group of people who are responsible for making big decisions for the charity, and making sure the managers are doing a good job.

Board members are called "trustees".

They are volunteers, which means they are not paid.

Most trustees spend 5-10 hours per month volunteering for the charity.



Support for taking up this role

Although the post of trustee is unpaid, Respond may be able to fund relevant governance training or help you need to do this role well. This could be someone you know who helps you already.
